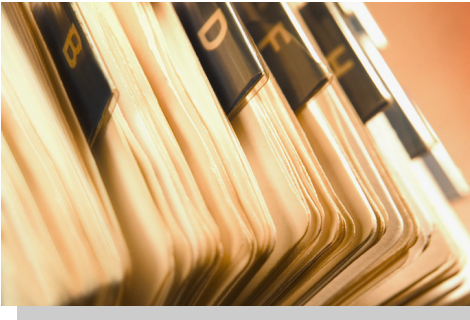

About Asian Americans for Community Involvement (AACI)



Focusing on the diverse Asian American community, Asian Americans for Community Involvement (AACI)'s mission is to improve the health, mental health, and well-being of individuals and their families by providing an array of human services. AACI empowers the Asian American community by working collaboratively for equality and social justice.

Founded in 1973, AACI is the largest community-based organization specializing in the Asian American community in Santa Clara County. Current programs include mental health and primary care health services, health education, HIV/AIDS prevention and testing, substance abuse treatment, programs for drinking drivers, a center for survivors of torture, programs and shelter for women and children who are domestic violence victims, a senior center, after-school youth programs, community advocacy, and English and citizenship classes. AACI serves over 8,000 clients each year, Asian and non-Asian.

About SACPA (Prop 36)

AACI's outpatient substance abuse treatment program SACPA (Substance Abuse Crime Prevention Act of 2000), also known as Prop 36, provides a treatment alternative to individuals who have been arrested for non-violent drug offenses. The goal of the treatment program is to assist clients in achieving abstinence and recovery from substance abuse.

AACI's SACPA Program offers a range of culturally and linguistically competent services to:

1. Address clients' substance abuse, and increase their ability to make healthy lifestyle choices.
2. Enhance clients' functioning at home, work and the community.
3. Link clients' with appropriate social services and community resources.
4. Provide information to assist family members or related persons in their understanding of mental illness/ substance abuse and in their interaction with their loved ones.



List of Services

Outpatient Treatment

- ◆ **Counseling provides** individual and group counseling.
- ◆ **Outpatient clinic** provides substance abuse assessment, and appropriate referrals to medical and psychological services.
- ◆ **Case management** is available for all clients on an as needed basis. Case management links clients to various community resources and provides translation when necessary.
- ◆ **Psycho-Education** provides education on psychopharmacology in cycle of addiction issues, relapse prevention, mental health issues, anger management, etc.

Method of Service

- ◆ Counseling staff provide an eclectic, individualized treatment approach with flexible hours and treatment planning based on each client's unique and special needs.
